#### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2. The rules are changed as follows:
  - 1.2.1. Rules 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10 are amended to add: "Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes of the first boat to finish in its class and not subsequently retiring, penalized or given redress will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing and scored for the finishing place two more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within her Finishing Window."
  - 1.2.2. Rule 40.1 shall be in effect. Each competitor shall wear a personal flotation device.
  - 1.2.3. The following is added to rule 62.1: "If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress request."
  - 1.2.4. The US Sailing prescriptions to rules 63.1 and 63.2 are deleted.
  - 1.2.5. Appendices A5.1 and A5.2 are amended to add: "A boat that has not met the definition

of start 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS.

1.2.6. Appendix V1, Penalty at the Time of incident will be in effect.

### 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at the skipper's meeting and via email to boats that preregister

### 3. COMMUNICATION

The official notice board will be located near the flag pole at Crosswinds Marina on a white board

### 4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. Regatta is open to the following classes
  - 4.1.1. Opti Green For kids 9 to 15 years old who know how to sail but have little or no racing experience
  - 4.1.2. Opti White, Blue, and Red Classed by age between 9 and 15 years old, for sailors ready for competitive racing
  - 4.1.3. 420s For sailors in 9th grade and below, with experience sailing this two-person boat
- $4.2. \, \mbox{Eligible}$  boats must enter by completing the

- 4.3. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees prior to the competitors meeting on October 14, 2023
- 4.4. Boats are encouraged to be class legal, but not required. Boats will be inspected prior to launching to ensure they have the proper floatation and are safe to sail.
- 4.5. Class legal sails are not required, but sails should be comparable to class legal sails
- 4.6. For 420, trapeze and spinnakers will not be allowed to be utilized.

### 5. FEES

- 5.1. Entry Fee: The entry fees are:
  - 5.1.1. Opti Green (beginner racer): \$25
  - 5.1.2. Opti Red, White, Blue: \$25
  - 5.1.3. 420: \$35

### 7. VENUE

Racing will be in the vicinity of Jordan Lake Marina

### 8. COURSES

The courses will be windward-leeward with either a finish upwind or downwind per the Sailing Instructions

### 9.SCORING

- 9.1. The low-point scoring system, RRS A2, shall apply with the following additions.
- 9.2. One race is required to be completed to constitute an event.

### 10. RISK STATEMENT

10.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

#### 11. PRIZES

- 11.1. Prizes below will be based on the number of boats registered by 23:59 October 6, 2023.
- 11.2. Prizes will be awarded for each fleet as follows:

- 12.5.1. GPS: Crosswinds Boating Center, 565 Farrington Road, Apex, NC
- 12.5.2. From Highway 64 West, turn right onto Farrington Rd
- 12.5.3. Drive about .2 miles and turn left into Crosswinds Boating Center entrance
- 12.5.4. Go to the stop sign at the bottom of the hill and turn right
- 12.5.5. Go to the end of the road and look for the flag pole to check in
- 12.5.6. Boats will be launched from the launch ramp or the sandy beach next to the launch ramp
